Children in the ASHA orphanage do not lack for stimulating toys and activities.

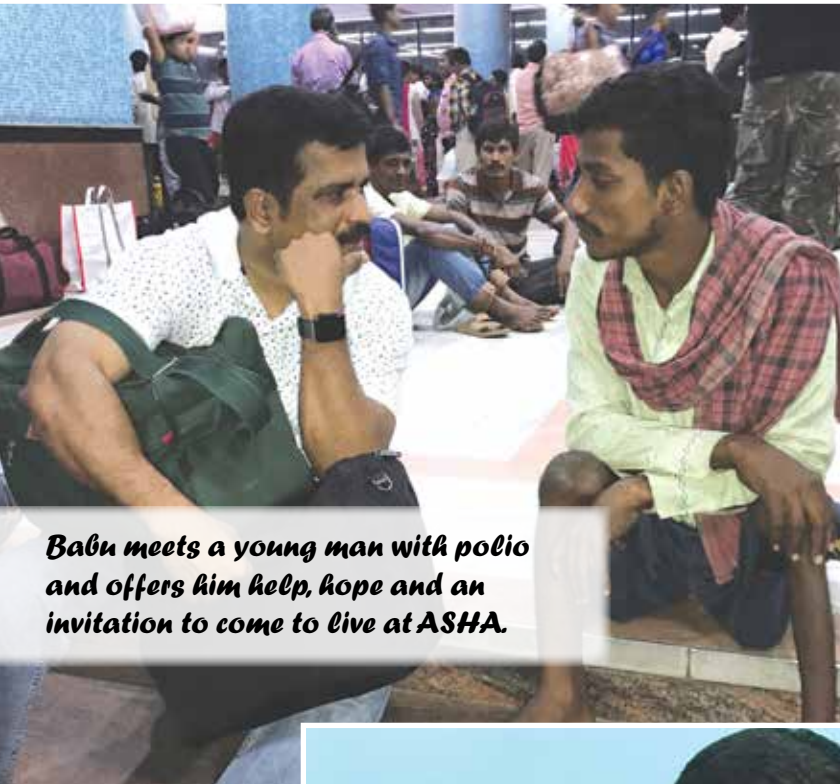

The staff didn't just feed the children the day of our visit, they fed over 200 people from a very humble kitchen.

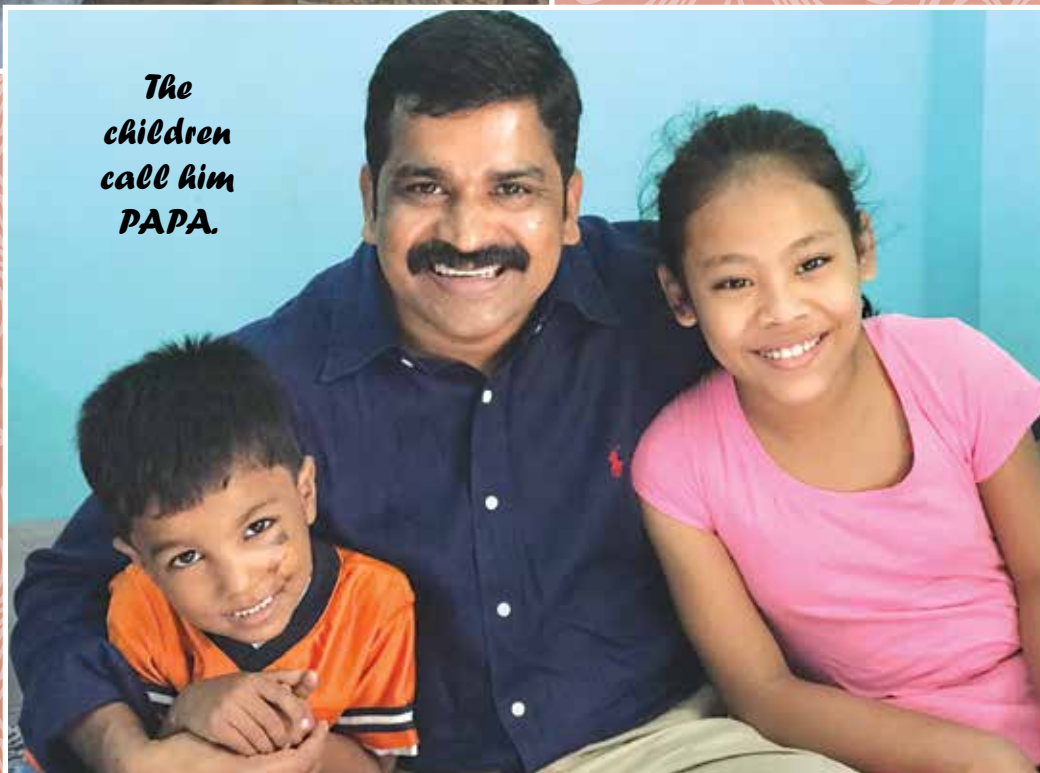

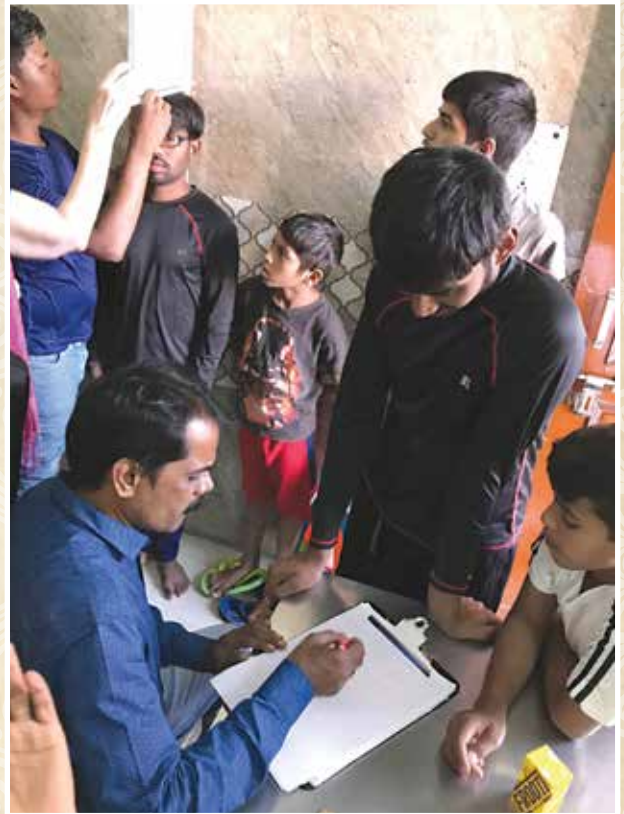


LEARN HOW TO EVALUATE CHILDREN FOR MALNUTRITION.
