

MAMA Kenya is coordinating 208 community health volunteers from MAMA Kenya and other organizations that work in the slums. The Worm Project donated 200,000 tablets of Albendazole 400mg enough for 200,000 people, mostly children, to be dewormed. The volunteers are going door to door. distributing the medication and assessing children for malnutrition, "Until the last pill is gone!" says Evelina Ndilu, our MAMA Kenva representative. We have 96 malnourished children in our program at various stages of recovery. We expect to see a surge of new cases that will need attention. Since we are not allowed to gather mothers into groups, we are preparing radio spots to share messages, and are negotiating for affordable air time in two slum radio stations.

MAMA Judia is making progress. Nurse Sajani has rented a room in the slum for \$35 per month. This is serving as a clinic for general medical care, and a center for teaching and rehabilitation of malnourished children. Then she and her husband, who volunteers in the slum, both contracted COVID. At last report, they are recovering.





MAMA Tanzania had a great experience with the mission trip- Mostly DeSales University Nurse Practitioner students to Shirati in February 2020. We were already planning the next trip, but that is on hold due to COVID. There is still much that we can do by raising funds and doing advocacy for the kinds of malnutrition and parasite programs that MAMA wants to do in the region.
