From January to September 2013, we treated 66 children (29) families) at our Nutrition Center. The malnourished children receive food, medicines, and care while their mothers receive education about healthy hygiene and living, including the importance of deworming, adding micronutrients to their food, filtering drinking water, having a garden, and taking care of animals. They also learn a handi-craft (crocheting, sewing, jewlery making, etc) and participate in daily Bible devotions. Once the children are starting to feel better and have more energy, they participate in Bible stories and other activities.

A family typically stays at the Center for 30-90 days to complete their treatment.



Adding micronutrients to the food that is being made in the home is allowing young children to grow healthy and strong, mothers to have babies that are more healthy from the start, and many to not have malnutrition.

MAMA distributes and educates about its Micronutrient Powder

to communities around Honduras. The cost is small but the effect is large!



In 2013, we held two Child Survival Trainings in Pennsylvania. These trainings allow other organizations and individuals to learn about MAMA's programs and replicate in the areas they serve. After receiving training, organizations have replicated MAMA's medical brigades in Nepal, Haiti, Kenya and starting in Guatemala.

MAMA Project also holds trainings in Honduras for village leaders. These leaders learn more about how to care for their community by encouraging use of micronutrients, deworming
